Who Do We Serve

- RAAM is a walk-in clinic, designed to offer rapid and timely access to anti-craving medication and clinical support to individuals with Substance Use Disorder.
- We offer brief addictions counselling, and help support connections to community resources.
- Provide nurse and physician follow up to monitor stabilization of prescribed anti-craving medications.

How to Access RAAM

- No referral necessary! You can call or present during clinic times and request service.
- We do accept referrals from community organizations.
- All clients must complete consent forms and intake during first appointment with our counsellor/nurse before being seen by a physician.

Services Offered

Substance Use Assessment

Everyone meets with our addictions counsellor and nurse for a brief intake. Short term support can be offered while you work together to connect to appropriate community resources—this may include a counsellor, groups, meetings, etc.

RAAM **does not** facilitate inpatient treatment referrals.

Medication Support

Those seeking RAAM services, must be willing to engage in medication support.

- Alcohol Use Disorder—withdrawal and anti-craving medications
- Opioid Use Disorder—Opioid Agonist Therapy (OAT)
- Stimulant Use Disorder—there are currently no approved anti-craving medications, but RAAM is still willing to assess.

Services Offered

Transfer of Care

RAAM is a short term program and our goal is to be able to transfer your care to long term supports in the community.

This may include:

- Ongoing follow up with your family physician
- Community counsellors/programs
- Opioid Assisted Recovery Services (OARS) for ongoing OAT prescriptions
 - OARS 20th Street Clinic
 - OARS Mayfair Clinic
 - West Side Community Clinic (WSCC)

RAAM Does Not Provide

- Pain management
- Long term care
- Long term counselling
- Inpatient treatment referrals
- Walk-in for psychiatry
- General medicine
